film, which broke all box
office records in Asia when
first released, also won
numerous awards at both
the Hong Kong & Golden
Horse Awards including
one each for best director
& best cinematography,
& two for best actor. It
stars Ti-Lung as a
gangster trying to go
straight but caught
between loyalty to his
down-&-out partner
(Chow Yun-fat) & rookie
cop brother (Leslie
Cheung), & the ominous
pressure of his former
triad bosses. One of
director John Woo's best
works, this film is a
characteristic combination
of masterfully
orchestrated balletic
violence & extremely
passionate & powerful
storytelling. (1986, 95

[John Woo series] The
team of awarding winning
director & actors return
in this sequel which has Ho
(Ti Long) cooperating with



his brother (Leslie
Cheung) & the police in
trapping a major
underworld figure. Dean
Shek also stars as Lung,
the target of mob
assassins, who is rescued
by Ho & sent to live with
Ho's friend & ex-gangster,
Ken (Chow Yun-fat) in
New York. The twin
brother of Mark (*A Better
Tomorrow I*), Ken is
living peacefully as a
restauranteur until
loyalty & fate conspire to
drag him back to the
violence & crime of Hong
Kong. (1987, 110 min.)
